New design opportunities for design and work

Introduction

IE School of Architecture and Design announces its fifth **IE SPACES FOR INNOVATION PRIZE** for young architects and designers worldwide. This award recognizes talented young designers by offering scholarships to our world-class Master's Degree, and facilitating full-time, paid internships in some of the world's top design firms.

The competition is open to all young architects and designers who completed their undergraduate or graduate studies during or since 2014.

The winning entries will be awarded admission* to IE's Master's in Strategic Design of Spaces for the 2019-2020 academic year; a partial scholarship towards the program tuition fees; and a full-time, paid, professional internship in one of three internationally-renowned design firms: UNStudio (Amsterdam, Netherlands), Studio O+A (San Francisco, USA), or Aecom (Madrid, Spain).

IE School of Architecture and Design

The IE School of Architecture & Design is one of the most innovative architecture schools in Europe. With a unique combination of design and entrepreneurship, the IE School of Architecture & Design pushes the boundaries of traditional architectural education. Our students are exposed to a multidisciplinary approach that prepares them to meet the needs of an ever-changing world.

Master in Strategic Design of Spaces

The Master's in Strategic Design of Spaces was created to provide students with the skills and knowledge necessary to approach challenges emerging in the world of interior space design.

The program focuses on three types of spaces; work, retail and education. We spend a considerable percentage of our time occupying these three spaces, and they continue to be in constant motion in terms of technological innovation.

The program was designed in partnership with the Helen Hamlyn Centre for Design at the Royal College of Art in London - a research center specialized in design ethnography - where students will complete one of the program modules.

Students will gain first-hand experience by working alongside leaders in the field when visiting top studios, and through attending an IE Architecture and Design special lecture series.

Requirements

The **IE SPACES FOR INNOVATION PRIZE** is open to all young architects and designers who finished their undergraduate or graduate studies in or since 2014.

This competition is for individual participants only. Teams and groups are not eligible.

Any person with links to the prize organization personal, professional, or otherwise – will not be eligible to participate in the competition.

Proposals will remain anonymous until after the Jury decision is announced.

* The winner must also meet the IE School of Architecture and Design admission criteria.

Winners must register for and attend the Master's in Strategic Design of Spaces, and complete their tuition payment.

Winners who decide to take on an internship are responsible for obtaining any necessary visas or permissions required by the host country.

Awards

The **IE SPACES FOR INNOVATION PRIZE** will hand out the following awards:

1ST PRIZE

- Admittance to IE Master's in Strategic Design of Spaces for the 2019-2020 academic year.
- €7,000 scholarship to be used for the program tuition fees.
- Full-time, six-month, paid professional internship at one of the following companies, starting in August 2019: UNStudio (Amsterdam, Netherlands), Studio O+A (San Francisco, USA), or Aecom (Madrid, Spain).

2ND PRIZE

- Admittance to IE Master's in Strategic Design of Spaces for the 2019-2020 academic year.

Objective

Candidates must present a digital collage where they illustrate their insights and reflections regarding the future of work, retail and educational spaces.

What will these spaces look like in two decades? How will we be working, shopping and learning? How will technology affect daily life in each of these spaces?

Candidates should explore these questions and express their ideas in a collage, using original or existing images. The collage allows candidates to highlight their professional or academic work, as well as depicting their sources of inspiration. When using images produced by a third party, be sure to clearly note the authorship. Texts and graphics may also be used in the collage.

Each participant must submit their collage before the deadline. The required documentation, including registration and submission forms, must be submitted digitally using the web platform at www.arquideas.net.

Document submission

The following files must be submitted:

- One (1) DIN A1 digital poster (594x841mm) in vertical disposition, in one single *.PDF file at 300dpi as a digital *collage*, where candidates will showcase their insights and reflections regarding the future of work, retail and educational environments. The maximum file size is 10 Mb.
- One (1) *.JPG file with a maximum recommended size of 1200px wide (about 1200x1700px) with the digital panel. This image will be used in the web preview, browser and project listings.
- Curriculum Vitae (CV) of the participant in *.PDF.
- A brief description (500 words, maximum) of the intentions behind the collage presented in *.PDF.

The submitted documents will be reviewed by a panel of judges. The participants will remain anonymous to ensure a fair and unbiased evaluation. To maintain anonymity, the documents will be identified solely by an identification code provided during the registration process. The code must be placed in the top right corner of each panel or document.

All texts must be in English.

Submissions will be accepted until midnight (GMT +0:00) on the deadline date.

All proposals presented will be included in a virtual exhibition on the competition platform website www.arquideas.net. The prize-winning projects as well as the Honorable mentions will be highlighted in this exhibition.

All submissions will be archived at Arquideas, which reserves the right to promote and publish the presented proposals.

Participation in the competition authorizes the reproduction, distribution and communication of the projects submitted to IE School of Architecture and Design and Arquideas.
